President Tony Tan Keng Yam visited Batam, Indonesia, today at the invitation of the Indonesian President His Excellency Dr Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono. While in Batam, President Tan had a meeting with and was hosted to dinner by President Yudhoyono. Both leaders reaffirmed the excellent and longstanding relations between Singapore and Indonesia. President Tan thanked President Yudhoyono for his strong support for deepening bilateral relations during President Yudhoyono's last ten years in office.

The leaders also had a wide-ranging discussion on regional and international developments. They agreed that a strong, united and integrated ASEAN was important for regional prosperity and for the region to address various common challenges.

President Tan also attended a tea hosted by our Ambassador in Jakarta for a group of Singaporeans in Batam. They shared with President Tan their experiences of working and living in Batam.

President Tan was accompanied by Minister for Transport Mr Lui Tuck Yew and officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Trade and Industry. President Tan returned to Singapore this evening.

His Majesty Tuanku Alhaj Abdul Halim Mu'adzam Shah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Badlishah, the Yang di-Pertuan Agong XIV of Malaysia, is on the second day of his three-day State Visit to Singapore today.

His Majesty and Her Majesty Tuanku Sultanah Hajah Haminah binti Haji Hamidun, the Raja Permaisuri Agong, began the day with a visit to the National Orchid Garden, accompanied by Mrs Mary Tan. In commemoration of the State Visit, an orchid "Aranda Abdul Halim Mu'adzam Shah" was named in honour of His Majesty. This was followed by Their Majesties' visit to Gardens by the Bay.

Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong and Mrs Lee called on Their Majesties today. Prime Minister Lee and His Majesty reaffirmed the longstanding ties between Singapore and Malaysia, and underscored the importance of strengthening bilateral cooperation and deepening people-to-people bonds between both countries.

Tomorrow, President Tony Tan and Mrs Tan will host and accompany Their Majesties on a tour of the Istana, the first for a visiting Head of State. President Tan and Mrs Tan will host an informal tea for Their Majesties after the tour.

His Majesty will also visit Reflections at Bukit Chandu, which commemorates the Battle of Pasir Panjang during World War Two. Their Majesties will visit the Night Safari to round up the State Visit. Their Majesties will leave for Malaysia on 22 May.

MFA Press Statement: 24th ASEAN Summit, Nay Pyi Taw, Myanmar, 10-11 May 2014

Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong attended the 24th ASEAN Summit in Nay Pyi Taw, Myanmar from 10 to 11 May 2014. The meeting was chaired by His Excellency U Thein Sein, President of Myanmar, and was attended by the Heads of State/Government of ASEAN Member States, the caretaker Deputy Prime Minister of Thailand and the ASEAN Secretary-General.

The ASEAN Leaders reviewed the progress made in establishing an ASEAN Community by 2015 since they last met in October 2013 and called for acceleration of efforts to implement the Blueprints of the three Community Pillars. They took note of the report of the High-level Task Force on the Strengthening of the ASEAN Secretariat and Reviewing the ASEAN Organs (HLTF) and welcomed progress in developing ASEAN's Post-2015 Vision. The Leaders exchanged views on regional and international developments, and discussed ways to sustain ASEAN's centrality in the evolving regional architecture. The Leaders also met with the representatives of the ASEAN Inter-Parliamentary Assembly (AIPA) and Youth. The Nay Pyi Taw Declaration on the Realisation of the ASEAN Community by 2015 was adopted by the Leaders at the end of the Summit.

The Leaders congratulated Myanmar on its inaugural Chairmanship under the leadership of President Thein Sein and aptly themed "Moving Forward in Unity to a Peaceful and Prosperous Community". They pledged their firm support for Myanmar's Chairmanship for the rest of 2014.

MFA Spokesman's comments in response to media queries on the South China Sea on 7 May 2014

In response to media queries on reports of several incidents in the South China Sea, in particular collisions between Vietnamese and Chinese vessels in the vicinity of the Paracel Islands, the MFA Spokesman said:

"Singapore is concerned about recent developments in the South China Sea. We call on all parties to exercise self-restraint and avoid actions that could escalate tensions in the South China Sea. We urge all parties to fully abide by the Declaration on the Conduct of Parties in the South China Sea and manage disputes peacefully in accordance with international law, including the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS). We also continue to urge ASEAN and China to work towards an early conclusion of the Code of Conduct in the South China Sea."

MFA Press Statement: State Visit of President Tony Tan Keng Yam to the Republic of the Philippines (2 to 5 April 2014)

President Tony Tan Keng Yam, who is in the Philippines on a State Visit, attended a Singapore Red Cross (SRC) event to hand over Singapore's contributions to post-Typhoon Haiyan relief efforts this morning. President Tan witnessed the signing of Memoranda of Understanding between the SRC and its movement partners, the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, and the Philippine Red Cross. He also presented cheques amounting to S\$7 million to SRC's partners for rehabilitation projects in the affected areas.

In the afternoon, President Tan was the Guest-of-Honour at the 11th Philippines-Singapore Business Council (PSBC)'s Roundtable Lunch, which was attended by Philippine Finance Secretary Cesar Purisima, Trade and Industry Secretary Gregory Domingo, Tourism Secretary Ramon Jimenez Jr. and business leaders from the Philippines and Singapore. President Tan highlighted the positive trajectory of the Philippine economy, which

presented opportunities to deepen bilateral economic ties, and encouraged the PSBC to further facilitate cooperation between enterprises on both sides.

President Tan will depart for Samar Province tomorrow, where he will hand over medical equipment to Basey District Hospital, as part of a rehabilitation project between SRC and ICRC.

In Samar, President will hand over medical equipment to the Basey District Hospital, a joint rehabilitation project between SRC and ICRC.

Official Visit by Prime Minister of the Lao People's Democratic Republic His Excellency Thongsing Thammavong, 20 to 21 February 2014

Prime Minister of the Lao People's Democratic Republic (Lao PDR) His Excellency Thongsing Thammavong called on President Tony Tan Keng Yam and Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong at the Istana this morning, and was hosted to lunch by Prime Minister Lee. During the call on President Tan, President Tan and Prime Minister Thongsing reaffirmed the warm bilateral ties as both countries celebrate the 40th anniversary of diplomatic relations this year. Noting the growing people-to-people linkages between our countries, President Tan and Prime Minister Thongsing also encouraged the deepening of bilateral economic relations. The signing of the Agreement on the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income (DTA) would facilitate greater trade and business linkages. President Tan and Prime Minister Thongsing also acknowledged that it was important for both countries to work closely together towards the goal of establishing an ASEAN Community by 2015.

During his meeting with Prime Minister Lee, Prime Minister Thongsing expressed appreciation for Singapore's assistance in building up Lao PDR's human resource capacity. Prime Minister Lee said that the Singapore Cooperation Programme has played a key role in facilitating greater bilateral exchanges, and Singapore remained committed to helping Lao PDR in its human resource development. Both leaders also noted the increasing pace of ASEAN integration, and reaffirmed their commitment to work together to ensure that ASEAN remained at the centre of regional economic cooperation.

Following their meeting, both Prime Ministers witnessed the signing of the DTA, and a Memorandum of Understanding on Collaboration in the Field of Technical and Vocational Education and Training between the Institute of Technical Education Education Services and the Lao Youth Union. Later that afternoon, Prime Minister Thongsing visited the National Orchid Garden, where an orchid hybrid "Dendrobium Thongsing Thammavong" was named in his honour. Prime Minister Thongsing departs Singapore this evening.

Prime Minister Thongsing will also officiate at the opening ceremony of the exhibition "Handmade in Asia – Weaving the Cosmic Serpent in Laos" on Lao woven textiles at the Asian Civilisations Museum on 20 February 2014.

Joint Statement of 2nd United States-Singapore Strategic Partnership Dialogue

Following is the text of a joint statement by Singapore and the United States issued on 27 January 2014 in Singapore.

The Permanent Secretary of Singapore's Ministry of Foreign Affairs Mr Chee Wee Kiong and United States Assistant Secretary of State for East Asian and Pacific Affairs Mr Daniel Russel met in Singapore on 27 January 2014 to co-chair the second United States - Singapore Strategic Partnership Dialogue. The dialogue served to enhance bilateral relations and the strategic partnership between the United States and Singapore. The co-chairs, in the spirit of equal partnership, mutual respect and desire to promote close cooperation, reviewed the robust array of initiatives undertaken between the two countries and sought new areas to create and expand cooperation in bilateral, regional and global matters of joint interest.

The co-chairs reviewed bilateral areas of engagement including economic and trade, defence and the US-Singapore Third Country Training Programme. They also discussed new areas of cooperation such as energy, climate change and sustainable development. The cochairs discussed recent developments in Southeast Asia, Northeast Asia and regional institutions such as the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), East Asia Summit (EAS), ASEAN Regional Forum (ARF), and Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC). Both sides committed to actively seek ways to further utilise such institutions to address shared challenges confronting the region including water management and the environment. They affirmed the importance of regional peace and stability, maritime and aviation security, freedom and safety of navigation and overflight, as well as unimpeded, lawful commerce. They also emphasised the importance for all countries in the region to resolve their disputes by peaceful means in accordance with international law, including the 1982 UN Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS) and urged all parties to exercise self-restraint in the conduct of activities. They continued to encourage ASEAN Member States and China to expeditiously work towards early conclusion of the Code of Conduct in the South China Sea (COC) and urged all parties to pursue their claims peacefully and in accordance with international law, including UNCLOS. The co-chairs also reviewed regional initiatives including the Trans-Pacific Partnership where they renewed their commitment to achieving a mutually-beneficial, high-standard agreement that will contribute to establishing an open and inclusive trade and investment framework in the Asia-Pacific. The co-chairs also had further dialogue on areas of global cooperation.

Both sides noted the robust level of high-level visits between the two countries. These include the official visit of Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong to the United States in April 2013, the official visit of Minister for Foreign Affairs and Minister for Law K Shanmugam to the United States in March 2013, the official visit of Minister for Defence Ng Eng Hen to the United States in December 2013 and the official visits to Singapore of United States Vice President Joseph Biden Jr in July 2013, Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel in June 2013, Secretary of Commerce Penny Pritzker in October 2013, Secretary of the Treasury Jacob Lew in November 2013 and United States Trade Representative Michael Froman in December 2013.

MFA Press Statement: ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting Retreat, 17 January 2014

Minister for Foreign Affairs and Minister for Law K Shanmugam attended the ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Retreat in the ancient city of Bagan, Myanmar today. It was a historic setting for a historic occasion. The Retreat is the first ASEAN Ministerial Meeting hosted by Myanmar under its inaugural ASEAN Chairmanship.

At the Retreat, the Foreign Ministers took stock of ASEAN's Community-building and regional integration efforts. Noting that two years remained to the establishment of an ASEAN Community on 31 December 2015, the Ministers affirmed the need to energize efforts to fulfil the Blueprint goals for the three Community pillars. They agreed to enhance cooperation on important issues affecting the region and explored ways for ASEAN to support the Philippines' reconstruction efforts in the wake of Typhoon Haiyan. With the dry season approaching, Ministers were urged to take steps to tackle the issue of transboundary haze pollution to protect the health and welfare of their peoples.

The Foreign Ministers exchanged views on regional and international issues, including recent developments in the East China Sea and South China Sea, as well as on the Korean Peninsula. They reaffirmed ASEAN's Six-Point Principles on the South China Sea and the importance of maintaining peace and stability, maritime security, freedom of navigation and overflight. They urged self-restraint in the conduct of activities. They also reaffirmed the importance of maintaining ASEAN's unity and centrality in promoting regional peace and stability in today's complex geopolitical environment.

In this connection, the Foreign Ministers expressed support for Myanmar's ASEAN Chairmanship and its theme "Moving Forward in Unity towards a Peaceful and Prosperous Community".

MFA Press Statement: ASEAN-Japan Commemorative Summit in Tokyo, Japan on 14 December 2013

Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong attended the ASEAN-Japan Commemorative Summit in Tokyo, Japan today to celebrate the 40th anniversary of ASEAN-Japan relations. The meeting was co-chaired by Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, and was attended by the Leaders of ASEAN Member States and Japan, as well as the ASEAN Secretary-General.

The Leaders reviewed existing cooperation under the ASEAN-Japan Plan of Action 2011-2015 to Implement the Joint Declaration for Enhancing ASEAN-Japan Strategic Partnership for Prospering Together and discussed ways to strengthen the ASEAN-Japan Strategic Partnership. In line with the objective of the ASEAN-Japan 10 Year Strategic Economic Cooperation Roadmap (2012 – 2022) to double the flow of goods, services and investments by 2022, the Leaders announced the substantial conclusion of the negotiations on the Services and Investment Chapters of the ASEAN-Japan Comprehensive Economic Partnership (AJCEP) Agreement.

The Leaders expressed appreciation for Prime Minister Abe's Five New Principles for Japanese Diplomacy, which outlined Japan's renewed engagement with ASEAN, including the promotion of people-to-people exchanges. In this connection, the Leaders agreed to explore the possibility of concluding an ASEAN-Japan Air Services Agreement. The Leaders also emphasised the importance of working towards a disaster resilient ASEAN Community and welcomed Japan's proposal to strengthen ASEAN-Japan disaster management cooperation.

The Leaders adopted the "Vision Statement on ASEAN-Japan Friendship and Cooperation: Shared Vision, Shared Identity, Shared Future" and its accompanying Implementation Plan, and issued the "Joint Statement of the ASEAN-Japan Commemorative Summit: Hand in hand, facing regional and global challenges". The documents are enclosed. The Leaders affirmed the strong and close ties forged over the past 40 years and looked forward to the next phase of ASEAN-Japan relations.

The delegations of the Governments of the Republic of Singapore and the Republic of Indonesia held the Ninth Round of Technical Discussions on Maritime Boundaries in the Eastern Part of the Strait of Singapore in Singapore on 9-10 December 2013, as a follow-up to the Eighth Round of Technical Discussions, which were held in Manado, Indonesia on 19-20 September 2013.
- 2. The Singapore delegation was led by Mr. Pang Khang Chau, Director-General, International Affairs Division, Attorney-General's Chambers. The Indonesian delegation was led by Mr. Octavino Alimudin, Director for Political, Security, and Territorial Treaties, Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- 3. At the Ninth Round of Technical Discussions, the delegations continued their discussions on the draft Treaty relating to the Delimitation of the Territorial Seas of the Two Countries in the Eastern Part of the Strait of Singapore.
